

# KDBC Covid Safety Plan

We re-opened on 18<sup>th</sup> July 2020.

Depending on infection rates in the WA community, Phase 5 is now planned to commence on Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> October 2020. It will see the removal of WA's 1 person per 2 square metre rule and the 50 per cent capacity for our major venues. Hard borders will remain in place.

Under Phase 4 organisations must continue to enable patrons' physical distancing, and they must maintain good hygiene practices for their premises to better protect the general health of our club members and our community.

KDBC bridge sessions are restricted to KDBC members.

**Tables numbers have increased to 14, allowing 56 members to play at each session.**

**Members must not come to KDBC if they are feeling even slightly unwell – especially if they have a temperature and any cold or flu symptoms.**

- Any player who is not feeling well or is unable to control a cough or has a high temperature, should not attend the club. Members should seek to be tested for Covid-19 if they have any respiratory symptoms.
- KDBC has purchased a touchless infrared thermometer. All members will be scanned before entering to play bridge. If anyone has a raised temperature, they will be asked to go home.
- If a member coughs or sneezes they should do so into their elbow or into a tissue which should then be disposed of in the bins in the playing room. Hands should be sanitised afterwards, especially as we then touch cards which are shared with other members playing that day.

## Physical Distancing

Western Australians are still advised to stay 1.5 metres away from other people whenever and wherever we can. Please ensure you remain 1.5 m from the director's desk.

KDBC cannot ensure that members will be 1.5 metres apart when playing at the bridge tables.

In other areas of the club members may choose to maintain 1.5 metres social distancing. To facilitate this: if any member requests another member to move away to enable this, they must comply.

Members should continue to avoid physical greetings such as handshaking, hugs, and kisses.

## Hygiene

- Members must use hand sanitiser as they enter and leave the premises AND before they make tea or coffee.
- Hand sanitiser will be available at each table.
- Bidding boxes will travel with each player throughout the bridge session. If you have your own bidding box, you are welcome to bring it to use.

- North is the only person who may touch the Bridgemate. North should enter all players ABF numbers. They will show the result of a hand to West to check. If all has been entered correctly and West agrees, North will confirm the result. If there is a disagreement North will call the Director.
- North must wipe down the Bridgemate at the end of the day's play with the wipes provided.
- Tablecloths will not be used.
- Tables will be sanitised at the end of each session by North and other table members.
- Players should sit back from the table to maximise social distancing.
- Biscuits will be wrapped in sets of 2.
- KDBC cups may be used. They will be cleaned in the dishwasher after use. The dishwasher cycle will be increased to 5 minutes per cycle. All cups and glasses must be washed in our dishwasher, none may be washed by members in the kitchen sink.
- Food or drinks may be consumed in the playing room in the lunch break of Mondays Bridge Session. Before bridge recommences all debris, coffee cups and disposable cups must be removed from the playing area and the tables used must be wiped down.
- Disposable cups for drinking water will be available and may be taken into the playing room. Members are encouraged to bring their own lidded water bottles into the playing room.
- Members should bring the exact amount of table money (\$6) or use tokens for payment to minimise handling of cash. Change, or credit, will not be given.
- Only the Directors will manage the air conditioners, as per usual.
- The Director will maximise the amount of fresh air in the room by opening windows.
- Please ensure you wash your hands thoroughly, using soap or hand sanitiser, after using the toilet.
- The club room surfaces are cleaned and sanitised after play by members of the MC. Drinks after play must not delay this activity and should be taken outside the club rooms.

### **Cleaning**

- The cleaner comes once a week.
- After each session:
  - All surfaces in the tearoom and kitchen will be cleaned and disinfected.
  - The handles of dispensers of hand sanitisers, the handle on the hot water urn, the water tap handles in the toilets and the handles of the doors into the rest rooms, the lids on the coffee, tea sugar jars and will be wiped after each session.
  - The hand sanitisers at the tables and in the tearoom will be topped up and wipes available at the tables will be replaced as needed
