

Did You Know?

By the Numbers

Here are some interesting number facts pertaining to The odds for a finesse when you lead towards an ace bridge.

Eddie Kantar, American teacher and expert, tells his students: 'Count your losers and then count your winners. If the answer does not come to 13, count your cards!'

Amongst all the games and sports, bridge surely has the biggest age gap between the oldest and youngest players. Florence Chadwick of Yorkshire, England, followed the tournament circuit at the age of 103. Meanwhile players as young as 7 have competed in bridge events.

A game called 'five-suit bridge', played with 65 cards was devised in 1937. The fifth suit ranked above notrumps and was worth 50 points per trick. Since the hands each contained 16 cards the 'book' was set at 8 tricks. The 65th card was placed face-up and known

as the 'widow'. The eventual declarer was allowed to replace any card in his hand with the widow card before play started.

-queen combination is 50%. No surprises there.

The record for the youngest player to achieve the rank of Lifemaster is held by Danny Hirschman of Southfield, Michigan, USA. He was 10 years and 2 months old when he accumulated the necessary 300 master points. Americans take an average of 20 years of playing bridge to achieve this level. Danny Hirshman achieved it in 15 months.

A hand that contains no card higher than a nine is known as a Yarborough. It is so named after Lord Yarborough who used to offer players odds of 1000 to 1 against picking up such a poor hand. He knew he was on a good thing because the odds against being dealt a Yarborough are 1827 to 1.
