you have points for game but would prefer to be in 4 Hearts if partner has the fit. Bid 2 Clubs, and if partner responds 2♥, go to 4. If partner bids 2♦ or 2♠, you can bid 3 no trumps

OPTIMAL TWOS

Three of our members recently played in a threeand-an-expert competition with Anne Ohlsen. They came back with this scheme for opening unbalanced hands.

Opening requirement is 6-10 HCP with a six card or two 5 card suits

2♦ promises either a 6 card ♥ suit, 2 five card minors or black suits.

2♥ promises either a 6 card ♠ suit or 5 ♥ with a 5 card minor

2♠ promises either 5♠ with a red suit, or 6♣ with 2 of the top three honours.

With a weak hand responder bids the next suit up for opener to pass or correct.

With 15+ points responder bids 2NT (forcing) Opener's rebid clarifies his suit holding.
